The Stunning Success of Kate Newlyn

Garden of England Sculpture Ltd would like to introduce two additional sculptures from one of the UK's foremost artists, Kate Newlyn.

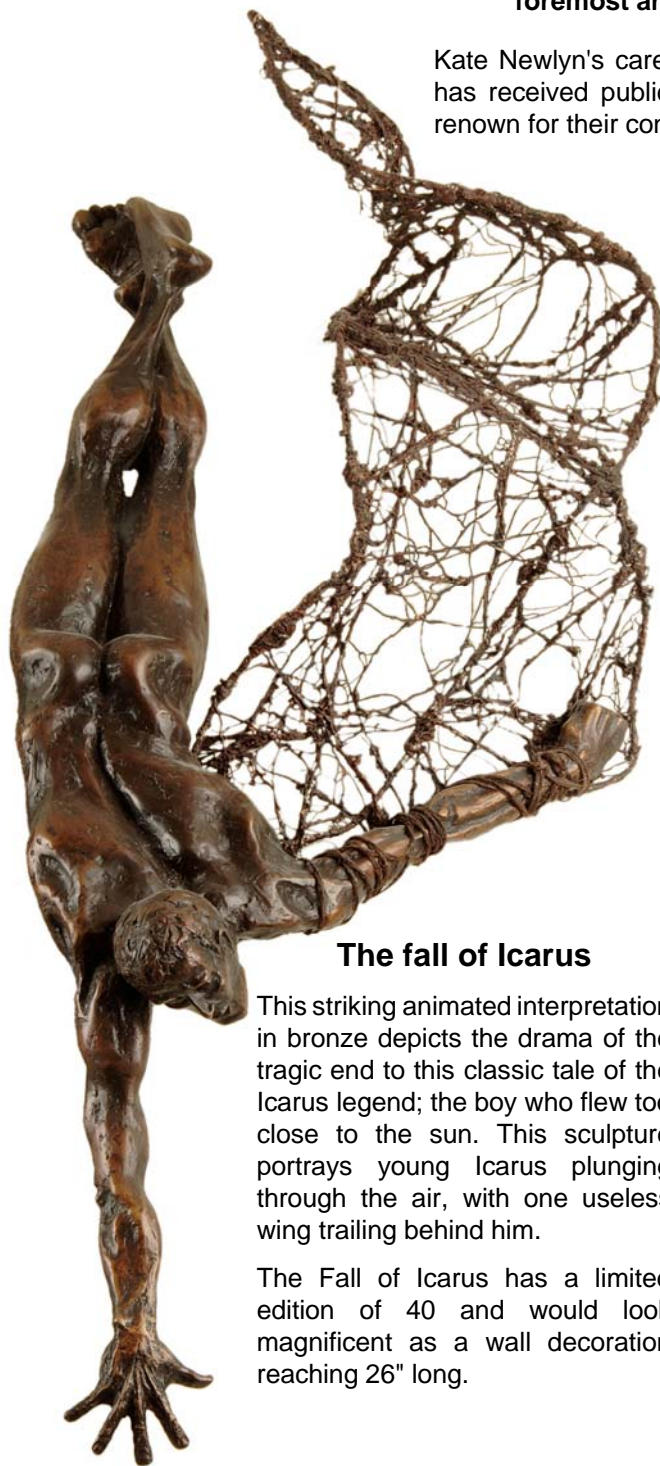
Kate Newlyn's career as a sculptor has spanned 18 years. During this time she has received public and private commissions and her sculptures have become renown for their connections with Greek myths and legends.

Kate's beautifully illustrated bronze sculptures command much attention and close inspection of their detail. 'The Fall of Icarus' and 'Apart we exist, together we are whole' join 'Ariel' to expand Kate's commissioned work by Garden of England Sculpture.

Although Kate created this sculpture to describe a strong sibling relationship it also speaks more widely of love, marriage, partnership and friendship.

The inspiration for this sculpture came from a trip to Ephesus, where rocks and boulders split by earthquakes and weathered by time, offered up images of figures. One such boulder stood out from the others suggesting that of a loving couple; two parts of one still standing together. This sculpture would be a charming room ornament reaching 6" tall and is part of a limited edition of 50.



The fall of Icarus

This striking animated interpretation in bronze depicts the drama of the tragic end to this classic tale of the Icarus legend; the boy who flew too close to the sun. This sculpture portrays young Icarus plunging through the air, with one useless wing trailing behind him.

The Fall of Icarus has a limited edition of 40 and would look magnificent as a wall decoration reaching 26" long.
